**MOVE**ictionary: A quick glossary of terms you'll hear thrown around while at MOVE.

### **KINGDOM WORKERS**

A Kingdom Worker is a Christian who uses whatever sphere of influence he or she has to proclaim the message of Jesus. Kingdom Workers include school teachers, moms, high school basketball players, bass guitarists, doctors and a countless list of others. Their ministry may look different, but they have each surrendered to Jesus, and are committed to using their gifts, abilities and relationships to advance his Kingdom.

### **ELECTIVES**

We give students the opportunity to encounter Kingdom Workers, hear Biblical truth taught and be exposed to some great Christian practices during elective time at Move. Electives are offered on a range of topics to provide ample opportunity for further discussion.

### **YOUTH GROUP TIME**

Each night after the Evening Session, each group will get together to talk about the day and pray together.

### **THE MOVE APP**

The Move app is available on every smart phone platform. The app contains information about Move and CIY, devotions for each day, the weekly schedule, and other pages just for fun! This app will guide your group through their week at Move.

### **SKIP-A-MEAL**

Once during the week, MOVE asks everyone to skip-a-meal. The money is used to help fund MOVE's International Conferences in places such as India, Ghana, Costa Rica, Philippines, Myanmar, and others. During "skip-a-meal" the campus will not provide a meal, however, you are welcome to take your group off campus for lunch.

### **THE ALTERNATIVE**

MOVE provides an opportunity for students to share their talents (singing, instrumental, bands, skits, poetry, comedy, etc.). Students sign up for limited spots and perform on the main stage.

### **THE NEXT LEVEL**

This is an option for graduated seniors. The Next Level is an in-depth Bible study taught by the Morning Speaker while everyone else is in Encounter Time. This is a great opportunity for them to get an inside glimpse of each day's theme, ask questions, and be challenged in their faith.

### **THE ÆFFECT STORE**

The Æffect Store is the place to purchase MOVE apparel and resources!

### **ENCOUNTER TIME**

Following the Morning Session, students and leaders are dismissed to Encounter Time and Small Groups. This creates an opportunity for them to participate in devotions that are tied to the daily themes. The devotions can be found in the Student Magazine.

### **EXTENDED RECREATION**

This is an opportunity for youth groups to enjoy an extended afternoon of free time. Many regions offer a wide array of activities to choose from such as hanging out at the beach or white water rafting.

### **AFTERNOON RECREATION**

The options at every campus are different and will be announced at the event. MOVE organizes tournaments during some of the afternoons: 3-on-3 basketball, volleyball, ultimate frisbee and dodgeball.

## MOVE Rules

1. Respect others and yourself.
2. No guys in girl's dorms beyond the front lobby and vice versa.
3. Alcohol, tobacco, drugs and weapons are absolutely prohibited
4. Everyone must be in their dorms by the designated "In Dorm Time".
5. For security reasons, no students with backpacks are allowed into the auditorium or cafeteria.
6. Follow the schedule. Be where you are supposed to be when you are supposed to be there.
7. During sessions, stay in your assigned seating. Please follow the posted seating chart.
8. Do not leave the auditorium once the speakers begin talking.

10. Do not move furniture as you will be charged for any assessed damage.

14. Students may leave campus ONLY with adult supervision; those staying behind must have an adult present.
15. Follow the dress guidelines.

## The Alternative

Here are the rules...

1. You get 2 mics & 2 direct boxes with instrument cables. That is all, nothing more, don't ask.... yes, we can hear your guitar.

6. You will have 3 minutes from start to finish, with a timer on the screen. So if you launch into a heartfelt monologue about how you wrote this song last night, and even if you start crying, the timer starts at your first word. Choose wisely.
7. There are a limited number of slots, when they are full, that is it. If you add your own lines to the signup sheet, we reserve the right to publicly embarrass you for not being able to follow instructions. Please write legibly, some poor intern has to type these into a computer so your name will appear on the screen, cut them a break.

<p><b>How many people stay to a room and what style are the rooms?</b></p> <p>Most of the residence halls on campus are three floors and have standard residence hall rooms. The majority of the rooms are doubles and some of the rooms are triples. Cook Hall offers suite style rooms, where two rooms are connected to a bathroom and accommodate four people. Dykstra Hall is set up in "cluster style" where several rooms are branched off from one common living space and share one common bathroom.</p>	<p><b>What types of bathrooms are available in the dorms?</b></p> <p>Communal bathrooms are in each of our dorms, with the exception of Cook Hall, which has suite style bathrooms.</p>
<p><b>Are the dorms air conditioned?</b></p> <p>Cook Hall is the only residence hall with air conditioning on our campus. We do encourage groups to bring fans with them.</p>	<p><b>Is there a pool on campus?</b></p> <p>There is a pool on campus. The pool is located in the Dow Health and Physical Education Center.</p>
<p><b>What kinds of recreation options are available on campus?</b></p> <p>There are several different options including three basketball/volleyball courts, three racquetball courts, and a track. Directly across the street from the Dow are tennis courts. The Pine Grove in the center of campus is a great space for activities such as frisbee, tag, etc. In the front of DeVos, the main meeting space for CIY, there is a large green space too.</p>	<p><b>What is the distance between the dorms, the main meeting space, and the cafeteria?</b></p> <p>The dining hall is located on the first floor of Phelps Hall, one of our residence halls. On average, the walk from one end of campus to the other is no more than 10 minutes. Our campus covers 8 blocks. The cafeteria is 1 block from DeVos (the main meeting space) and 1 block or less from each residence hall.</p>
<p><b>What are the food options available on campus?</b></p> <p>There is a main cafeteria on our campus where all meals will be eaten. The main cafeteria has several different options which are offered buffet style along with salad and desert bars. We also offer a convenience center called the Kletz. At the Kletz, students can purchase snacks and beverages. It is located in the basement of the DeWitt Center. In this space there is also a TV, a foosball table, and space to hang out.</p>	<p><b>What is the best restaurant on campus or near by?</b></p> <p>Downtown Holland is located 1 block away from campus. There are 24 restaurants downtown that offer a wide range of eating experiences. New Holland Brewery and Fricanos have excellent pizza. 84 East is known for their Italian food. Froggy's and Gregordog serve hot-dogs and Froggy's has hamburgers too. Two very popular coffee shops are Lemonjellos and JP's.</p>
<p><b>What is there to do during Skip-a-Meal?</b></p> <p>Hope is 15 minutes away from Lake Michigan. We would recommend taking a trip to the beautiful state park for a dip in the water.</p>	<p><b>Why should I choose your campus?</b></p> <p>Youth ministers should choose Hope College because it is the total package. Hope College is grounded in the historic Christian faith and actively supports the mission of CIY. Not only are our facilities topnotch, but the campus is very safe and the community is very friendly. Holland, Michigan is absolutely gorgeous in the summer time with endless opportunities for fun around our campus. Beaches, bike trails, and downtown shopping are just a few of the exciting things to participate in that separate Holland from other cities.</p>
